# CLT & CLT10

## AT A GLANCE

Classic Learning Test offers a college entrance exam (the CLT) and a college preparatory exam (the CLT10) that assess aptitude and achievement. Both exams promote logical and critical thinking and feature reading passages from classic and historical texts. Students can use these exams to apply to colleges, earn scholarships, and identify their academic strengths and areas for improvement.

### CONTENT & QUESTION TYPES

The CLT and CLT10 both have three sections: Verbal Reasoning, Grammar/Writing, and Quantitative Reasoning. Each section contains 40 questions for a total of 120 questions.

The reading passages used on the CLT and CLT10 include the following subject categories: Philosophy/Religion, Literature, Science, Historical/Founding Documents, Historical Profile, and Modern/Influential Thinkers.

Both tests contain questions in the domains and subdomains shown below; however, the CLT10 contains fewer questions of the highest difficulty level, and the reading passages used on the Verbal Reasoning and Grammar/Writing sections of the CLT10 are 25 words shorter on average than those on the CLT.
