

An Overview OF CLT³⁻⁸

CLT3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 are diagnostic and summative assessments designed for 3rd-8th grade students. They can be taken on paper or online and provide in-depth analytics reports to equip educators.

CLT3-6 contain four sections:

- Verbal Reasoning: Grammar (30 questions, untimed)
 - o Orthography, parts of speech, and sentence structure & diagramming
- Verbal Reasoning: Reading Comprehension and Writing (30 questions, untimed)
 - o Textual analysis, reading comprehension, and writing concepts & skills
- Quantitative Reasoning: Math Content (25 questions, untimed)
 - o Arithmetic & operations, geometrical reasoning, and mathematical reasoning
- Quantitative Reasoning: Reasoning Skills (25 questions, untimed)
 - Arithmetic & operations, geometrical reasoning, and mathematical reasoning

CLT7-8 contain three sections:

- Verbal Reasoning (40 questions, 45 minutes)
 - Textual comprehension and textual analysis
- Grammar/Writing (40 questions, 40 minutes)
 - o Grammatical editing and improvement
- Quantitative Reasoning (40 questions, 50 minutes)
 - Logic and mathematics

The "classic" in Classic Learning Test refers to our emphasis on timeless, foundational skills in language arts and mathematics, as well as our use of classic literature and historical texts for the majority of reading content on our exams. CLT3-8 feature rich and engaging reading passages for young learners, including classic children's literature, fables, poetry, historical non-fiction, and more. Assessing intellectual aptitude and achievement, CLT3-8 are a great fit for students from a variety of educational backgrounds, including classical, private, charter, and more.

CLT3-8 can be taken in-school during a four-week period offered once in the fall and once in the spring. Partner schools that administer CLT3-8 receive full support from the Classic Learning Test (CLT) team before and after testing. This includes special pricing, analytics reports for individual students and the entire testing group, and a dedicated CLT representative to assist with the testing process and analytics interpretation.
