Remote Proctoring Internet Suggestions

We are thrilled that you will be joining us for the remote-proctored CLT! Below are some requirements and suggestions regarding your internet setup for our remote-proctored test.

Before testing, evaluate your connection speed at speedtest.net (click the circled "GO" button towards the center of the page). Note the *upload* speed, **not** the ping or download speeds. An upload speed of at least **2.0 Mbps** is recommended.

If your upload speed is below 2.0 Mbps, here are some suggestions to increase it:

1. Make sure no one else in your household is using the internet for high-bandwidth activities (e.g. online gaming, streaming high-quality video).
2. Try connecting to your network via an [Ethernet cable](#). It may improve your connection speed and stability.
3. Get as close to the router as you can, if you're using Wi-Fi.
4. Try using a mobile hotspot (only recommended if you have an unlimited data plan).
5. Try a different device. Newer devices tend to be the most compatible.
6. As a last resort, try a different location, such as a friend or family member's house, or a private room at a library, church, or community center.

Be sure to test your upload speed at speedtest.net after trying a new option.

Please note: It is recommended that you evaluate your connection speed on the day of the exam, as well as beforehand, as speeds can differ from day to day. Speeds may even vary while you are testing.

It is also **strongly recommended** that students in the same household test at different times in order to have sufficient internet bandwidth available during the exam.
