To Test or Not to Test? That Is the Question!

Parents of All School-Aged Students

Testing does not need to be an anxiety-ridden experience. How can you utilize assessments in an edifying way and benefit tangibly from the results? This workshop will address questions related to testing and assessments, their benefits and limitations, and how to use them in your homeschool. The impact and prevalence of testing in society will be considered, along with common terms related to testing and college admissions.

Soaring Through the Admissions and Scholarship Process

High School Students and Parents

Other topics will include grades, GPA, and college admission testing. A discussion of the pros and cons of credit by testing and dual enrollment along with how to measure student readiness for them will be included.

Not Just a Face in the Crowd: Standing Out in Admissions and Scholarship Applications

High School Students and Parents

This workshop covers the aspects of applying for college and scholarships that extend beyond your academic preparation. The discussion will include extracurricular activities, volunteering, the college essay and interview, test-optional admissions, and other considerations that can affect the process. Timeline suggestions for each year of high school will be provided.

I Got My Acceptance Letter! Now What?

Juniors, Seniors, Recent Graduates and Their Parents

This workshop explores a path to success in college (and tips for parents who are cheering them on). Topics will focus on academic success, social life, time management, finances, and what it takes to transition successfully to a post-graduation career. Topics for parents will include how to encourage and support students without being accused of "helicopter parenting."

I'd Love to Go to a Christian College, But How Can We Afford It?

High School Students and Parents

This workshop explores ways to make the private college experience affordable. Topics will include the college search process, how to maximize institutional scholarships, and how to find outside scholarships. The discussion will also include an introduction to the financial aid process along with real talk about expenses, long-term financial considerations, and critical questions to ask.
